Ordered, That on Wednesday, March 15, 2017, notwithstanding Rule XXII, following Leader remarks, the Senate proceed to executive session for the consideration of the nomination of Daniel Coats, of Indiana, to be Director of National Intelligence, and that the time until 10 a.m. be equally divided in the usual form and at 10 a.m. the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture.
