Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Thursday, May 18, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Rachel L. Brand, of Iowa, to be Associate Attorney General, with the time until 12 noon equally divided in the usual form.

Ordered further, That notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the post-cloture time on the Brand nomination expire at 12 noon on Thursday, May 18, 2017.

Ordered further, That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

Ordered further, That the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Terry Branstad, of Iowa, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the People's Republic of China, occur following disposition of the Brand nomination.

Ordered further, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Terry Branstad, of Iowa, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the People's Republic of China, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.
