UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Timothy J. Kelly (Cal. No. 171)

Ordered, That at 5 p.m. on Tuesday, September 5, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of Timothy J. Kelly, of the District of Columbia, to be United States District Judge for the District of Columbia.

Ordered further, That there be 30 minutes of debate on the nomination equally divided in the usual form, and that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on confirmation with no intervening action or debate, and that if confirmed, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.
