# UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

## John C. Rood (Cal. No. 508)

*Ordered further*, That at 5 p.m., on January 3, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of John C. Rood, of Arizona, to be Under Secretary of Defense for Policy.
