## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered further,* That following the cloture vote on the Werfel nomination, and notwithstanding Rule XXII, the Senate resume legislative session.

*Ordered further,* That if any nominations are confirmed during Wednesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Mar. 6, 7, 2023.*)
